- Write a short plot summary of the book (200 words max).
- 2. Where did the story mainly take place? Make a list of at least 10 examples of descriptive language used to describe the settings?

- Write a letter to a character from the book
- Make a puzzle of a scene or character
- Create a poem about the text
- Create a crossword puzzle based on the book
